

Prize-winning architect Richard Meier creating Opus Place master plan

Olympia Heights Management has released more details about the Opus Place project at 98 14th Street in Midtown, which will feature a master plan designed by world-renowned architect and Pritzker Prize-winner Richard Meier. Meier, known in Atlanta for his design of the High Museum, is also the architect of the Getty Center in Los Angeles, the Des Moines Art Center in Iowa and the Jubilee Church in Rome, among many other commissioned works throughout the world.

The project will feature the city's tallest residential building – to be called No2 Opus Place – designed by Perkins + Will, which will rise 74 stories. Meier will also design a “cultural and commercial pavilion” on the 4.5 acre site, according to a media release.
